Prior to the start of each FGCU Commencement ceremony, graduating students can participate in a survey about their employment, educational status, and future plans. Below are the survey results of Bachelor degree candidates from the last four graduating classes.

FGCU Graduates: Employment and Earnings

The majority of FGCU graduates remain in Florida, at least initially, after graduation. The rate at which graduates have obtained employment in Florida and their average salaries within one year of graduation continues to be high. According to data collected by the Florida Department of Education*, FGCU graduates rank favorably in relation to graduates from the ten other state universities who remain in the state of Florida to work. ^{*} The Florida Department of Education administers a data reporting system called FETPIP, or Florida Education and Training Placement Information Program. FETPIP collects data that describes the employment rates and earnings of Florida university graduates who remain in the state of Florida.

Where is the Class of 2000-2001?

We thought it would be interesting to see if FGCU graduates from ten years ago – students from the Fall 2000 and Spring 2001 graduating classes - were still in Florida. The FETPIP staff ran a report to see how many were employed in the state of Florida as of Fall 2009, which was the most current data available. Of the 434 Bachelor graduates and 186 Master graduates, 79% and 85% were employed in Florida, respectively. Below is a breakdown of the number of graduates from each program and percentage of those students employed in Florida.
